

Bassoon Fingering Chart

The chart is organized into six systems, each containing two staves (treble and bass clef). The notes and their corresponding fingering patterns are as follows:

- System 1:** A, B, C, C#, D, D#, Eb, E, F. Includes note E with '(lowers pitch)' annotation.
- System 2:** F#, G, G, G#, Ab, A, A#, Bb, B, C, C#, D#.
- System 3:** D, D#, Eb, E, F, F#, G, G, G#, Ab. Includes notes D and E with '(lowers pitch)' annotations.
- System 4:** A, A#, Bb, B, C, C#, D#, D. Includes notes A and B circled.
- System 5:** D, Eb, E, F, F#, G, G, G#, Ab. Includes notes G and Ab with 'for sturs' annotations, and G and Ab with 'opt. 1/2 h.' and 'h. h.' annotations.
- System 6:** A, A#, Bb, B, C, C#, D#, D. Includes note D with '(D key is unavailable)' annotation.

(When more than one fingering is shown, the first is the most common.)
