Prepare a 3-ring Binder containing:

- 1. **Descriptive Essay** including the following: (Be Creative!)
 - a. Describe yourself. Help me get to know you.
 - b. Explain what position you are applying for.
 - c. Define a leader in your words.
 - d. What are your strengths and weaknesses?
 - e. What policies, procedures, or traditions would you like to see kept intact.
 - f. Give some thoughts on how you would make your applied position better.
 - g. How does a leader attain the attention and respect of their section without abusing their power?
 - h. React to the following scenarios:
 - 1. As a student leader you will be watched carefully by students and staff. What does this mean to you? How can this be a positive or negative situation?
 - 2. The band director has made a decision or statement that you disagree with strongly. What is your role, and when/how should your concerns be expressed?
 - 3. Below are 7 traits of an effective leader. Please respond to each trait:
 - i. Make others feel important and valuable.
 - ii. Promote a vision.
 - iii. Follow the "Golden Rule". (Treat others the way you would like to be treated.)
 - iv. Admit mistakes.
 - v. Criticize others only in private.
 - vi. Be Visible and Loyal.
 - vii. Instill a healthy competitive drive.
- 2a. **Officer applicants**: (President, Vice President, Secretary)
 Please develop a list of items regarding any aspect of the band

program that you believe could be improved. I would like for you to focus on areas of need that can be directly affected by the council. Please avoid certain executive decisions that I have to make. Please list the improvement needs along with ideas for how to make change!

2b. **Councilor applicants**: (Librarian, Equipment Manager, Historian, Public Relations)

Describe a small project needing to be done in your applied area. Explain exactly what needs to happen. Accomplish the project before the submission deadline.

2c. Brass/Woodwind Captains applicants:

Create a sample lesson plan for a week of warm-ups before rehearsals, a Friday night game, and a Competition. What should your 'line' accomplish, and how should that important time run? Think ideally and be thorough. Also, how will you develop a relationship with your staff Caption Head? You only have 15 min per rehearsal.

NOTE: These positions may be appointed during the summer. At this point, I am just looking for interest.

2d. Section Leader applicants:

Create two sample lesson plans for sectional time. One with a visual or feet timing intent and one with a musical or 'work' intent. Give minute by minute detail for each plan- total sectional is 30 minutes. Be creative.

3. Final Step:

The last portion of the application I am leaving up to you! I want you to show me your creative and imaginative side. I want students in the leadership council that are not afraid to be themselves, and are continually creating new ways of solving problems or making the band better. There are no boundaries with this- you can create, write, organize, perform, develop, or help with anything that portrays you as a unique and creative person. Most importantly, have fun!
