## Prepare a 3-ring Binder containing:

- 1. **DESCRIPTIVE ESSAY** including the following: (Be Creative!)
  - a. Describe yourself. Help me get to know you.
  - b. Explain what position you are applying for.
  - c. Define a leader in your words.
  - d. What are your strengths and weaknesses?
  - e. What policies, procedures, or traditions would you like to see kept intact.
  - f. Give some thoughts on how you would make your applied position better.
  - g. How does a leader attain the attention and respect of their section without abusing their power?
  - h. React to the following scenarios:
    - As a Drum Major, you will have additional freedom, and "free time". How would a responsible leader use the extra time? What daily responsibilities would be appropriate?
    - 2. The band director has made a decision or statement that you disagree with strongly. What is your role, and when/how should your concerns be expressed?
    - 3. In every season, there are times when emotions get high and negativism can frequently occur. The staff may be visibly discontent or over demanding. Students are threatening to quit. Every year there are certain student leaders that rise through their own frustrations (without others knowing it) and begin to mend the group. They appear "to never have a bad day", and remain a true "core" of the band. Think through this. What is the role of the Drum Major?
- 2. **ICE BREAKER**: Please create a game/activity that could be played at a New Member Camp or Band Camp that would allow everyone to get to know each other. These activities should be carefully thought out to include everyone, and to not embarrass anyone.
- 3. **CREATIVE PROJECT**: The last portion of the application I am leaving up to you! I want you to show me your creative and imaginative side. I want students in the leadership council that are

not afraid to be themselves, and are continually creating new ways of solving problems or making the band better. There are no boundaries with this - you can create, write, organize, perform, develop, or help with anything and whatever that portrays you as a unique and creative person. Most importantly, have fun!

LASTLY, prepare the score to '<u>Dawn of a New Day</u>' by James Swearingen. You will conduct (memorized) to the audio track provided.
