# Program Notes



**Musical selections from *The Sight of Music*:** Featuring the great musical score by Rodgers and Hammerstein, '*The Sound of Music*,' we invite you to listen to the blend of form and color and watch as the Thunder Marching Band's Front Ensemble performs musical selections from the Desert Vista Thunder Marching Band's 2018 program "*The Sight of Music*."

***Crystal Moon*, Larry Clark:** *Crystal Moon* was commissioned by the Kansas Music Educators Association and was premiered by the North-Central District Middle Level Honor Band in February of 2003. Designed as a showcase for the advancing young band, *Crystal Moon* was written to help performers work on playing light staccato passages. (From score program notes)

***Song and Dance*, Richard Saucedo:** Exuberant and entertaining, this dynamic work is written all in one tempo and is perfect as a concert opener or festival number. Saucedo combines a tongue-in-cheek style with some jazzy elements while featuring brief solos for flute, clarinet, and bassoon. Definitely NOT just some "song and dance." (Note from Hal Leonard website)

***Prelude No. 2*, Ney Rosauero:** *Prelude No.2* was written in 1986 as an homage to the great Brazilian composer Heitor Villa Lobos, who served as Rosauero's main inspiration and motive for writing music with Brazilian roots. The first theme is a tribute to the master, and the second and third themes are based on melodic sequences that are characteristic of the *Bachianas Brasileiras* series of Villa Lobos as well as on diminished chord passages that are common in his works for guitar. ***Imaginarium*, Randall Standridge:** Inside every person, there is a place where creativity dwells. Gears turn, dreams flow, and ideas spark into life. This idea-factory or "Imaginarium" is the place that every creative person goes to, again and again, to find their muse, flesh out ideas, and to exert change on the world around them. This piece is dedicated to all of the dreamers who see more in the world than is actually there, who see possibilities where others see only dead ends, and who believe in creation rather than destruction. (Note from Standridge's website)

***Among the Clouds*, Brian Balmages:** Flying is a favorite activity of lucid dreamers, who are able to become aware that they are dreaming and then control their actions while inside the dream. *Among the Clouds* takes us into the minds of these dreamers as they drift off to sleep and wake up in a world where they own the skies. (Note from FJH publishing)

***Salvation is Created*, Pavel Tschesnokoff:** *Salvation Is Created* was conceived as a six-voice choral work in 1912. It is an arrangement of a Kievan chant, originally set in Church Slavonic, a slavic liturgical language still in use in some Orthodox denominations. The form is very simple, consisting of two nearly identical verses that differ only in their final cadences. (From [windliterature.org](http://windliterature.org))

***Vesuvius*, Frank Ticheli:** Mount Vesuvius, the volcano that destroyed Pompeii in A.D. 79, is an icon of power and energy in this work. With its driving rhythms, exotic modes, and quotations from the *Dies Irae* from the medieval Requiem Mass, the work represents a dance from the final days of the doomed city of Pompeii. (Paraphrased from Ticheli's program notes)
