Program Notes

Fanfare for the Third Planet

Fanfare for the Third Planet (2005) was commissioned in 2004 by the Keller Independent School District, Texas. A dedication to our own planet Earth, this impressive piece features a rhythmic vitality throughout, along with fresh harmonies and skilled orchestral devices. Amid the powerful fanfare-like phrases, a brief calm section is created using the woodwinds and a unique layering effect before building to the dynamic ending.

Journey Through the Void

A Journey Through the void has two connotations. The first is space, with a crew about to embark on a Star Trek-esque voyage of discovery. The second connotation is of going caving. In both instances, the journey begins with a sense of trepidation. You are faced with a brooding darkness. What lies beyond hidden in that darkness? Then you begin and trepidation is overtaken by excitement. The unknown is now a thrilling, exhilarating voyage of discovery.

Beyond The Seven Hills

This fun and energetic piece is the best-filled with tone clusters, percussive effects, and a driving rhythmic feel, and a sizzling, climatic coda. At times slow and mysterious, at times powerful and driving, Beyond the Seven Hills by Sweeney maintains a high intensity level throughout.

E Pluribus Unum

E pluribus unum —Latin for "Out of many, one" —is a 13-letter traditional motto of the United States. The march was originally published in 1917 under the C.L. Barnhouse Publishing House. It is known that Jewell wrote a number of marches with patriotic titles. E Pluribus Unum March was composed during the dark days of World War I.

A Childhood Hymn

A Childhood Hymn (1991) is an arrangement of a classic children's hymn. The soothing harmonies provided by this master band composer enhances the simple beauty of the melody.

To Awaken the Dragon

This programmatic tone poem for symphonic band opens as Mount Pilatus slumbers at night, shrouded in darkness and mystery among the clouds high above Lucerne. As dawn breaks, a band of courageous adventurers climb Pilatus in search of dragons to slay. After an arduous journey filled with breathtaking views and terrestrial beauty, the adventurers finally stumble across a dragon lair. They awaken the mighty dragon who must now battle the intruders of his domain. All but one adventurer are mortally wounded, leaving the pitiful human to beg for mercy and forgiveness from the dragon. Demonstrating great compassion, the dragon produces a magical stone, called draconite, from his own wounds in order to heal and save the intruders. In doing so, the dragon has also placed compassion and tolerance in the hearts and minds of man, leading them to a happy and peaceful coexistence with the dragons of Pilatus.
